- Good class if you eventually want to take Early Childhood Ed at ACC!

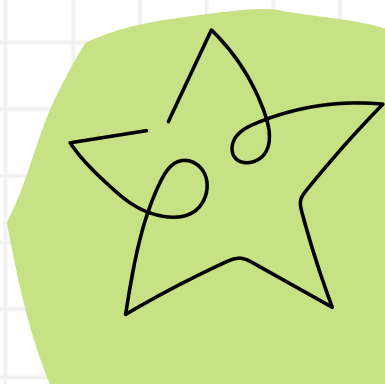
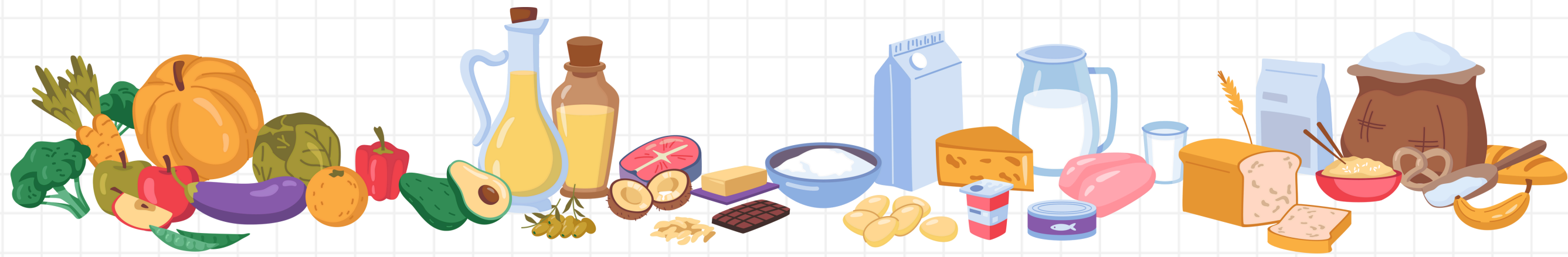

Explore the responsibilities of journalists, editors, producers, and directors

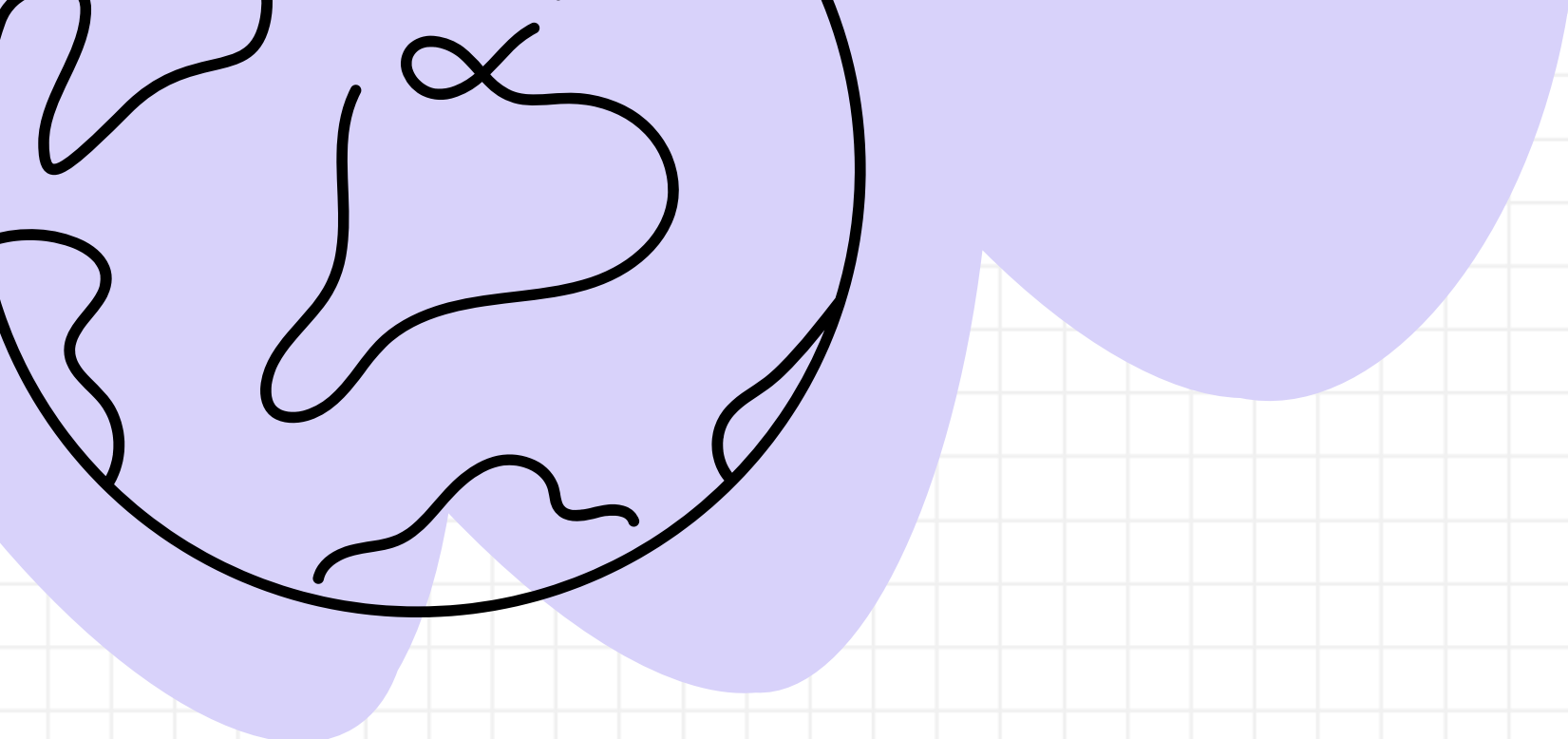
