



High School Terms to Know

- **Credit:** Unit earned upon successfully completing a high school course
- **Verified Credit:** A unit earned by passing an end-of-course SOL tests or other assessments approved by the Board of Education.
- **GPA (Grade Point Average):** It is computed based on number of courses taken and grades earned in those high school courses
- **Transcript:** A document that lists every high school class you took, when you took them, and the grade you received in each class







Information for Summer 2026 will be coming in late February.


We do not know the details on summer course offerings yet


