#### Virtual Classroom

- ★ Platform: Zoom- Our ASL classes will use Zoom for instruction daily.
- ★ Learning Management System: <u>Canvas</u> All information in classes are all in Canvas. Students are to log in daily in order to access materials for class, announcements, homework, sign vocabulary words, and other resources.

### ZOOM

APS is currently using Microsoft Teams for all their classes. However, APS has approved ZOOM use for American Sign Language classes for several reasons.

The video quality in ZOOM to see the signs are clearer and smoother than in MS Teams. It includes a feature where your child(ren) will be able to view the presentation slides & watch their teacher signing at the same time, as compared to no feature with MS Teams.

Another feature allows your child(ren) to be able to see other students & use signs with each other. That is essential for class discussions & working with peers.

### **CANVAS**

Everything will be posted via Canvas.

All Google Slides will be posted after class that day.

All videos are there. Students are expected to know how to navigate through Canvas and find necessary files, such as Google Slides & videos.

## A Typical Week

Mondays will be asynchronous - self-paced work.

Tuesdays through Fridays will be synchronous and on a block schedule - each class will meet every other day for 90 minutes.

On these days, each 90-minute class will meet for about 50 minutes of live virtual class time & 40 minutes of independent work.
